Daniel 6:3-10 KJV

[3] Then this Daniel was preferred above the presidents and princes, because an excellent spirit was in him; and the king thought to set him over the whole realm. [4] Then the presidents and princes sought to find occasion against Daniel concerning the kingdom; but they could find none occasion nor fault; forasmuch as he was faithful, neither was there any error or fault found in him. [5] Then said these men, We shall not find any occasion against this Daniel, except we find it against him concerning the law of his God. [6] Then these presidents and princes assembled together to the king, and said thus unto him, King Darius, live for ever. [7] All the presidents of the kingdom, the governors, and the princes, the counsellors, and the captains, have consulted together to establish a royal statute, and to make a firm decree, that whosoever shall ask a petition of any God or man for thirty days, save of thee, O king, he shall be cast into the den of lions. [8] Now, O king, establish the decree, and sign the writing, that it be not changed, according to the law of the Medes and Persians, which altereth not. [9] Wherefore king Darius signed the writing and the decree. [10] Now when Daniel knew that the writing was signed, he went into his house; and his windows being open in his chamber toward Jerusalem, he kneeled upon his knees three times a day, and prayed, and gave thanks before his God, as he did aforetime.

The Corruption of the Earth:

- 1. What God Saw: so much wickedness that He had regret for creating man.
- 2. How God Felt: sorrow and regret, grief.
- 3. What does God do about it?
- 4. The opposition Noah faced building the Ark
- 5. The courage Noah exhibited while facing his opposition and obeying God.
- 6. Continued to build
- 7. Refuse to be discouraged

The Basis of Daniel's Courage:

- 1. That the idea came from God
- 2. That God remained with him throughout.
- 3. The clarity of God's instructions to him.
- 4. The experience of God's strength in him, God won't call you to do something that he won't equip you for.
- 5. The warning of God's coming judgement.
- 6. The favor of God that overshadowed him.
- 7. The intimate relationship with God, this was before scripture or written word.
- 8. The promise of God regarding his future.

Daniel's Conviction:

- 1. Diet refused to eat food offered to idols.
- 2. Told the king the truth.
- 3. He refused to bow down to idols.
- 4. He believed God would protect him.
- 5. He always gave God credit for deeds.

Daniel's Motivations:

- 1. Was taught well by his parents
- 2. His study of the Word of God.
- 3. His love and devotion to God.
- 4. His desire to obey God
- 5. His desire to be a witness for God.

Benefits of Daniel's Conviction:

5. God gave him favor with kings.

Consequences:

- 1. The king died like Daniel said.
