John 14:27 KJV

Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

1. The Truth That God Controls our Circumstances

- 1. He does not want us to behave as though we are independent from Him.
- 2. His desire is for us to grow and be like His Son.

2. The Truth that God will Meet Our Needs

- 1. God does not promise to meet all of the needs of the unbeliever, but he does promise to meet the needs of those who believe in Christ Jesus.
- 2. If God is for us, who can be against us but if God is against us who can possibly be for us.
- 3. If God sacrificed His own Son for us because of His love for us, it leaves nothing for us to worry about. God delights in meeting our needs.

3. The Truth that God is With Us

- 4. No one can take us away from God once we become one of his own; no action, no thought, no sin, no desire; even the devil cannot act independent from God.
- 5. I will never leave you or forsake you.

4. The Truth that God Loves Us with Eternal Love

- 6. God loves us before our creation, during and after we leave this earth.
- 7. Jesus said I will go to prepare a place for you and I will come back for you.
- 8. He loves us in a way that we cannot imagine; Agape love, perfect love, not the kind of love that can be imitated by man.
